It is a village affair with eight to nine gardens opening and two pop-up tearooms with home baked cakes. We now have some regulars who keep us on our toes and we love it. Come and enjoy the diversity, we aim to give visitors an afternoon of discovery. Our gardens have been chosen because they are all different in spirit and tended by young and weathered gardeners. 

A fabulous collection of diverse gardens all set around beautiful 17th, 18th and 19th century Northamptonshire stone houses. Expect packed perennial borders, topiary, bulging vegetable gardens and productive orchards. The gardens range in size from several acres to ones that offer great ideas for smaller gardens. Two are designed by James Alexander-Sinclair.

Two adjacent villages set in the rolling south Northamptonshire countryside with a handsome medieval church in Weedon Lois. The extension churchyard contains the grave of the poet, Dame Edith Sitwell who lived in Weston Hall (not open), marked with a gravestone by Henry Moore. We have two new gardens this yr, one a colourful garden with interesting perennials, a cutting bed, fruit and vegetables and the other where an enclosed and peaceful garden has been cleverly created out of a very steep site. There is also a long established plantsman's garden, herbaceous borders, vegetables, roses, woodland planting, a large wildlife pond and much more. So we hope you will join us for our open day, enjoy looking round our gardens, visit the plant stalls and tuck into our famous home-made teas. Not all gardens suitable for wheelchairs.


